Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The Final International Event of KASPI 2.0, hosted by the Municipality of Pomiechówek, Poland, represented the culmination of a European cooperation project dedicated to empowering young people through digital literacy, inclusive communication, and active participation in democratic life. The meeting brought together young participants, local authorities, stakeholders, and partner municipalities from across Europe, creating an important opportunity not only to celebrate the achievements of the project, but also to strengthen the partnerships and shared vision that had developed throughout its implementation.

Over the course of KASPI 2.0, the project consistently promoted youth engagement by encouraging dialogue, intercultural understanding, and responsible participation both in digital environments and within local communities. The final event therefore served as a moment of reflection and evaluation, allowing participants to assess the project's impact, exchange experiences and good practices, and discuss future opportunities for cooperation beyond the official end of the initiative.

A central focus of the event was the strengthening of youth participation and European citizenship. Through workshops and discussions, young people were encouraged to see themselves as active contributors to their communities, capable of promoting democratic values, civic responsibility, and social inclusion. Participants explored the important role that youth can play in shaping more resilient and participatory local societies.

Another key aspect concerned inclusive communication and digital responsibility. The activities highlighted how respectful language, media literacy, and critical thinking can help counter misinformation, hate speech, and online discrimination. By reflecting on the challenges of the digital age, participants developed a deeper understanding of how responsible communication can contribute to more inclusive communities.

The event also reinforced the importance of international cooperation. Years of collaboration among the partner municipalities had created a strong network based on trust, mutual learning, and the exchange of experiences. The final meeting further consolidated these relationships and encouraged the development of future European initiatives and joint projects.

Intercultural dialogue remained a constant thread throughout the programme. Bringing together participants from different countries and cultural backgrounds helped foster mutual respect, understanding, and a stronger sense of European identity. Informal conversations, group activities, and shared experiences proved just as valuable as the formal sessions in building lasting connections between participants.

The programme combined educational activities, institutional meetings, and cultural experiences. The event opened with welcoming speeches from local authorities and project representatives, who presented the achievements of KASPI 2.0 and outlined the objectives of the concluding meeting.

The main workshop was organised around the theme "Connecting Voices: Building Inclusive Communication and Youth Dialogue for Stronger Communities". Discussions focused on inclusive language, responsible digital communication, youth participation, and the importance of face-to-face dialogue in strengthening social bonds and community engagement.

Partner municipalities also presented examples of successful initiatives implemented during the project, highlighting innovative approaches to youth involvement, social inclusion, and local participation. Dedicated networking sessions allowed participants to discuss future cooperation opportunities and identify potential areas for new international projects.

In addition to the working sessions, participants took part in cultural and study visits within Pomiechówek and Warsaw. These visits offered insight into the region's historical, cultural, and economic heritage while creating valuable opportunities for informal networking and relationship-building.

The final event generated several important outcomes. It strengthened the European partnership established through KASPI 2.0, creating a sustainable network that will continue to support future cooperation. Young participants increased their awareness of democratic participation, digital responsibility, inclusion, and European citizenship, becoming potential ambassadors of these values within their own communities.

The workshops also contributed to the development of stronger digital and social competences, enhancing participants' critical thinking, communication skills, and ability to recognise misinformation.

At the same time, the exchange of best practices between municipalities provided practical ideas that can be replicated in future European cooperation projects.

Perhaps the most significant legacy of KASPI 2.0 is its long-term impact on European solidarity and youth empowerment. By encouraging dialogue, inclusion, and active citizenship, the project has laid the groundwork for continued collaboration and for future initiatives aimed at building more connected, resilient, and participatory communities across Europe.

The Final International Event successfully concluded the KASPI 2.0 journey, demonstrating how international cooperation can empower young people to become informed, responsible, and active European citizens. Through dialogue, collaboration, and shared experiences, the project contributed to strengthening local communities while reinforcing the common European vision of inclusion, equality, and democratic participation.

The partnerships created throughout KASPI 2.0 will continue beyond the project's official lifetime, opening new opportunities for collaboration and helping to shape a more united and resilient European future.
